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This was a period of intense activity for the DOS/Win Business Unit which I don't expect to subside for several months.

Short-term business, product and compositive pressures for both Windows and DOS are presenting a real challenge to continuing to focus on the ambitious development projects underway and but now also providing the appropriate level of responsiveness to the short-term business/marketing requirements.

This coincides with a period of transition in the marketing side of the business unit with Joe Rehfeld leaving, a new Windows marketing team transitioning in and the second DOS marketing position not yet filled (new identified, but not yet here). In addition, program management for Windows in proxy sied down with issues on Windows 3.0, making it difficult to really bear down on the short-term needs.

Also, development is bringing in loss of new SDE's and we are still understaffed on the DOS development term.

Everyone is scrambling to pull it all off. We will

- A number of reasonably thorny leases have spring up recently, e.g. DOS Extenders. We need to react/move very quickly in these areas wishout compromising our achedules.
- The invest are sending to obscure the real progress being made in virtually all areas. Phil Barrett, Chris Doser, Pascal Martia, Rick Hargrove and Jody Sandgress go into store detail in their attached mostily reports. On balance, my judgement is that we are making excellent progress, aspecially when considering the setfing/project status only two months ago. An extraordinary amount of progress has been made.

- Current Business/Product Status
- Windows abort-term business continues to follow the same pattern of extremely strong Win/286 betiegs and extremely weak Win/286 betiegs. We have just completed a re-forecast of the fiscal year which indicates we still expect to come in at 95% to forecast for USSMD betieges. Seveng Win/286 betieges, SDK and exceptional (but low-margin) IBM volumes will offset lost Win/286 and upgrade revenue.

There has been a nignificant increase in negative feedback coming from field SE's in USSMD regarding Windows' product performance when running 3270 programs or on

Colone Boyer and Jody Snodgrass are driving a project to do whatever we can to resolve/address these issues by Feb. 1. In the process of addressing this issue, we believe that some process issues related to how PSS, field SE's and HQ program mgt. and evelopment all work together also need to be addressed—and that will be a challenge. In addition, there are clearly issues related to expertise and suising underlying this problem. We will try to articulate these issues.

- In general, there appears to be a consensus contrying that Win/386 2.1 has competitive problems vs. some alternative solutions for either multisating DOS appe or running Windows apps for performance. We have initiated a short-term sales plan to drive USSMD sales for the January-March period and our goal is to latep the business moving until Win/386 version 3.0, which provides superior benefits to the existing competitors.
- There has been a noticeable increase in concern on the part of the major OEMs regarding incursions/momentum by the Macintonia. Zeaith and Compaq are embusiastic about Win 3.0 plane. IBM and Zeaith are also focusing on Windows 2.1 as the competitive newer to the Mac. Dale Christianson wrote an excellent summery of the mage of IBM activities based on Windows, inclinding some major success stories and we had good masting with Zenith and IBM education mariesting groups.
- COGS: We presented a COGS plan for the USSMD business to Suveh, Soone and Jons and have established the COGS targets for the balance of FY '99 and FY '90. This plan indicesse that Windows product line Gross Margin will go from FY '38 actual of 68% to a projected 79% in FY '90.
- Windows Market Research: Griggs and Anderson presented the results of a comprehensive research study of Windows Users on 12/15. We are reviewing this research in terms of its implications for all aspects of the Windows business.
- The revised Windows ad campaign sourced in Documber, along with the new SDK ad campaign. Also, the brand campaign is now running. Hopefully we will see the impact of the designed-in synergy of those campaigns and see a boost in short-zero pull through.
- Windows ISV activity continues to be very positive. We had montage with a number of ISVs, including Xerox, Software Venemes and Asymmetria, which will forto the bests of an excellent product out contains a market to 1Q/2Q CY '89. Sherry Richardson has updated the Windows dam base which currently shows 45 new Windows applications in 4Q CY '89 and an additional 15 scheduled for 1Q CY '89. (see complete report attached)."

Notable ships include Samaa Assi (12/5) and Xerox Presents (12/12).

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- 2 Windows 3.0
- a. We complemed major project reviews with Szeveh and Billy. Key issues that surfaced are: Default Ruby dealmops; 286 prosect mode Windows; status of Write and of Asymetria, In addition we are revisiting our plans for Win286 (non-prosect mode) given the existing concerns about memory on networks.
- Windows 3.0 3DK plane were finalized during the period. An issue remains regarding Codeview-W.
- LSV deliverables for the February period were finalized, and planning for ISV distribution has begun.
- d. Final Specification for all components of Windows 3.0 were completed and copies distributed to the Field SE's, internal groups and OEM account sign. on 12/19.
- B. DOS

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- DOS 4.01: This release has condensed to be plaqued by very minor lumes. We believe the streaming is now stable.
- a. (BM denying they have a problem with EMS support has caused continued press coverage. I permeded IBM to call PC Week and clarify things, which they did and a favorable article followed. I think this should ond this PR ananyance.
- b. BAX and Packaged Product confusion over 4.01: This is an assocying large that hat had no business impact. On 10/25, final 4.01 BAX and Packaged Product were shipped. However, these releases displayed 4.0 as the version aember. This caused some confusion. Effective 12/15, the version displayed will say 4.01, but applications will still pick up 4.0 when they query DOS. This approach resolves the requirements of vertice-bound apps so detect 4.0 with the market requirement to see 4.01 displayed. This fix will go out to OEMs in the flast BAX on 12/19 and be shipped in OEM packaged product effective 12/25. Ted Hanness is working through the account sags, side and McIvin on the packaged product side.
- DRI competitive situation: AB key OEMs have algued up for DOS 4.0 and the Shell (except AST which is a special case situation). DRI continues to be very active and presents a revesue concern emong the low-end clone vendors. Melvink is tracking down accounts that we are a ware of that potentially are going to DRI. We are having some good success here.
- We developed and shipped (11/9) as \$0\$1/\$0\$46-specific version of DOS for the international market. Unfortunately as of 12/15, very little marketing of this release has gone on. Jerermybu is aware of this and is addressing the issue.

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- We made a docision to procond on an ASAP basis to implement a version of DOS that executes out of ROM, while remining compatibility with Win386 and aerworks. MS-J is also working on a similar project in Japan (although based on 3.3) and we will my to coordinate efforts here.
- We reviewed some other options with billig
- We need to figure out a way so get beant FR visibility for DRI's compatibility westmeases.
- Surve Ballmer had a promising discussion with DRI re: them licensing MS-DOS vs. competing with us. Surveb will follow-up with Jeachinek
- Retail Upgrade: We have made good progress here in serum of evaluating the technical feasibility of the project. So far it looks feasible. We are now expanding the ecope of the investigation from the initial 5 OEMs to also include a brunder base of international OEMS and more domestic OEMs.

We really need to begin the process of developing the result marketing and support requirements for this product. This includes making sure that our OEM customery comfortable. Company expressed some concerns that we need to follow-up on.

We also need to make a final determination on which DOS 4 shell gets included (IBM or DOS Manager derivative). Final resolution of the DOS Extender situation may also have

DOS Extenders: The development team has some up with DOS extender technology that we are evaluating for compercialization. We reversed this plan with Serveb and Billy.

Recent information that Lones is planning to use both 256 and 386 DOS Extenders is creating some real-time activity to determine our final course of action.

There are several technical issues related to 286 DOS extenders (not 386 DOS extenders) that also peed to be resolved.

- DOS 4.1. We reviewed those plans with Staveb and Billg. Bazically, the plan is to have DOS go into Himsem (extra 64k; of conventional memory) if no other app is using it. There are some sticky issues related to extended anxibute support in DOS that need to be recolved. We are finalizing those issues and a few others and finalizing the process document and the contract with IBM.
- DOS Shell: We are working with MS-I to provide a DOS 4.0 Shell based on the CW technology vs. the IBM Shell for reasons of double-byte support and screen drivers etc. We will probably use this same shell for the DOS 4.0 retail approace.

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C. Multimedia Systems

- During this period, the multimedia tools group was established and given its mission to develop and deliver windows-based multimedia authoring mols to ISVs in time to support (a) a select group of ISVs for initial machine ship and (b) a broad base of ISVs in 4Q CY '89.
- Preliminary specifications for a scriptung language and the Audio API specifications were delivered to NDA ISVs on 12/9.
- We had a major project review with Strveb and Bills which run out of time. We need to complete the review of this project. Surveb will help drive closure on the contract issues with our samegic partner.
- Rick Hargrove's Status report (annohod) covers the balance of insues/status (annohed to limited distribution list only).
