General Report

Mr Richard Anthony ROTHWELL was 47 years of age having been born on 10th August 1961 at Enfield. He resided at 11, St Marks road, Stourbridge, West Midlands, with his wfe. He has three children and was a Company Director of a Community Initiative Company. He would also teach in his spare time.

He had recently been concerned about a VAT inspection which was due, and it was causing him a great deal of stress.

On the 15th July 2009, his wife Mrs Pauline Gibbard, their son and a friend went to a festival in Taunton for a few days leaving him home alone.

At 0815 hours on the Friday 17th July 2009, Mrs Gibbard received a text message from Mr Rothwell which caused her some concern. As a result she has made numerous unsuccessful attempts to contact him during the day.

He has also sent text messages to both his daughters the same day. They were also a cause for concern.

Mrs Gibbard has returned home at approx 1730 hours on Friday 17th July 2009, and found a handwritten note on the kitchen table. It was from Mr Rothwell stating that he had ended his life. (see statement) She immediately contacted the local police.

Mr Rothwell's car is known to have entered Pembrokeshire at approx 1150 hours on Friday 17th July 2009.

At 0930 hours on Saturday 18th July 2009, a male walker on the coastal path near Pwllderi, North Pembrokeshire, discovered a bag, coat and a plastic cup containing a small amount of red wine on a bench on the edge of the cliff. He has then found an empty bottle of red wine and an umbrella approximately 30 yards further up from the bench near the cliff edge.

The content of the bag was examined by the walker Mr Mark Rooney, who found a handwritten message on the back of a business card. (attached) The instructions were to contact the police which Mr Rooney arranged.

Mr Rothwell's vehicle was recovered approx 1-2 miles away in a car park at Garn Fawr, Pwllderi. Another note has been found inside the car addressed to his mother. Its content showed a clear intention to end his life. (attached)

The Coastguard, Lifeboat and RAF Sea King helicopter have all attended at the area and conducted an extensive search for Mr Rothwell.

At 1335 hours on Saturday 18th July 2009, Coastguard officers located him half way down the cliff face, directly below the point at which the umbrella and bottle of wine were found.

He was recovered to the top of the cliff by Coastguards where ROLE was implemented by Paramedics and life was pronounced extinct.
