Richard, here is the agenda we are proposing with IBM to use with Compaq. The background on this is that IBM is pushing ahead with 1.3 / 1.31 as their primary release and don't plan on supporting 1.21 with unbundled EE. They informed us of the reality of 1.31 as another release during my visit with them in December. I am still trying to decide what my group can handle wrt to 1.3 and 1.31, the issues being intl versions and user-ed. My initial reaction is to ship a final 1.3 with docs to domestic OEMs at the end of Jan and then wait for 1.31 before I provide translated versions. The current IBM 1.31 schedule is 3/28 for general availability. I'll let you

know the schedule for 1.31 intl versions in the next several weeks.

IBM now feels solely responsible for the success of OS/2. Especially against Windows. They see MS as their distribution channel for that 25% of the market that is non-IBM, but an important market since their customers want a second source of hardware and OS/2. They view us as a risk to the success of OS/2 and hence their angst over when and what we ship. They have been holding meetings on their own with OEMs to discuss their ES plans, getting loaner hardware in Austin for ES testing, and IBM SE plans. Based on my conversations with Compaq and Olivetti, the OEMs are getting mixed messages from IBM and MS. My objectives in having joint meetings with selected OEMs are:

- (1) discuss the technical content of 1.31 and determine if there are any OEM issues.
- (2) discuss the IBM ES plans in general, I doubt that IBM would give specific dates, but would let it be known that they won't support 1.21 and would actually prefer 1.31.
- (3) have the OEMs tell IBM in front of me their issues with shipping multiple releases; resource, user-ed, manufacturing, etc. We carry this message to IBM, but they suspect we are intentionally dragging our feet to slow down OS/2.
- (4) discuss early 2.0 plans and also OEM content issues we have identified and represented to IBM. I think IBM wants to get validation from the OEMs.

The bottom line is that IBM is driving toward independence from us and I think they will try to deliver their own retail OS/2 with OEM H/W support in the 2.0 timeframe (10/91). In the meantime, I'm trying to keep IBM out of the OEMs by convincing them we are representing them well

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and convincing the OEMs that our public statements about IBM owning core development and MS the OAK and OEM distribution channel are true. I wanted to have these meetings to present a united front. As you and I agreed, we will only meet with Compaq, since they themselves requested such a meeting. We have told IBM we will not meet with Tandy, IBM is planning on meeting with them anyway, they already have contacts established. I don't agree that this is the best way to proceed, but I'll respect your desire to maintain account control. Just be aware that IBM will be meeting with the OEMs without us and I think we will continue to look like less than partners.
